1. Overview

This dataset is a collection of records from a great variety of sources, collating information which is not suitable for inclusion in other datasets. Records relate to employment, clubs and society membership, residence, land ownership, and many other categories.

The groups of records contributing to this dataset range from tiny (20 or fewer) to thousands of records. Each group of related records is assigned to a 'set', e.g. "Land Ownership & Use", and the group may be further qualified in the *Event*, *Source* and *Source2* fields.

This documentation does not attempt to describe each group, but singles out those which may require further clarification, both to source and the content and meaning of some fields. Many groups, have no additional documentation.

A small list of those undergoing confirmation at Buchsfelde Lutheran Parishes (Daveyston, St Pauls, Tanunda) and St Martins Church of England (Campbelltown). Source: Church Records. Coverage: Buchsfelde - 1883 to 1892; St Martins – 1887 and 1892

3.2 Gawler Congregational

Membership of the Gawler Congregational Church. Source: Church Records. Coverage: 1851 to 1873, some records undated.

3.3 Quakers – Society of Friends

Member and associates of the Society of Friends (as the Quakers called themselves). Source: Variety of SAGHS documents. Coverage: 1839 to 1925.

3.4 Tea Tree Gully Baptist

Membership of the Tea Tree Gully Baptist Church. Source: Church Records. Coverage: 1860 to 1917, some records undated.

4. Clubs & Societies

4.1 Ancient Order of Forresters Admission

Source: Gazette. Coverage: 1862 to 1864, some undated.

4.2 Dingabledinga Red Cross Sewing Circle

Mainly committee members. Coverage 1939, 1940, 1944.

4.3 Hope Forest WAB (Women's Agricultural Bureau)

This is a list of the WAB's members mentioned in the bureau's members lists and meetings. With graphics. Note that a person's name may be mentioned more than once in each pdf document. Coverage: 1956 to 1988.

4.4 Millicent Bowling Club

Presidents, Secretaries, Club Champions. Coverage 1932 to 1987.

4.5 Millicent Croquet Club

Presidents, Secretaries, Club Champions. Coverage 1929 to 1986.

4.6 Millicent Indoor Bowling Club

Presidents, Secretaries, Club Champions. Coverage 1966 to 1987.

4.7 Old Contemptibles Association

Coverage: 1950.

4.8 Tantanoola Football Club 1971-1986

Annual trophy winners. Coverage: 1971 to 1986.

4.9 Wickham's Hall Trust Subscriptions

Coverage: 1930 to 1933.

5. Commemorations & Memorials

This section is for recording community commemorations and memorials, including plaques, signs, etc. Note that many other 'memorials' are more likely to be recorded in the Cemeteries dataset, which includes graves and memorials.

7.5 Dentists Register

This is the 'general' register. Coverage: 1901 to 1999.

8. Directories & Censuses

8.1 1839 Directory of Adelaide

This group contains records from the first South Australian directory, published by Thomas & Co., the publishers of *The South Australian Register*.

8.2 1841 Census - South Australia

The census was taken late 1840 to early 1841. Note that much of the biographical information has been added later from other sources. In the *Notes* field, "Household=" describes the sexes and ages of the members in the household, e.g. 2xF21-34 means 2 females aged between 21 and 34 inclusive. Source: Collection from Graham Jaunay. Coverage: 1840-1841.

District A: north of Bay Road (now Anzac Highway) & Greenhill Road excluding Adelaide but including Port Adelaide and west of Mt Lofty.

District B: south of Bay Road and Greenhill Road to 35°10' and west of Mt Lofty.

District C: from 35°10' [i.e. mouth of the Onkaparinga River] to 35°20' [i.e. base of Sellicks Hill] and west of Mt Lofty.

9. Electoral Roll, Voters, and Residents

9.1 Adelaide City Citizens Rolls 1854-1910

These electoral rolls list those who can vote in Adelaide City municipal elections, which apply to the city square and North Adelaide. To qualify citizens had to either own or occupy property within the city. Some of the entries are from the Supplementary List, which may include those added after the roll closed.

Apparently, these were paupers from the poorhouse in the parish of St Martin in the Fields who arrived on the ship Calcutta. Source: Government Gazette. Coverage: 1853.

13.3 Various Other

14. Land Ownership & Use

14.1 City of Adelaide Town Acre Grants

Coverage: 1837.

14.2 Council Ratepayers

A list of ratepayers of various councils across South Australia. Shows number of acres and amount of rates paid. Source: Government Gazettes. Coverage: 1850 and 1851.

14.3 Cultivators

From a supplement to the 1841 census (see section 7.2), this collection records land use for a limited number of settlers. The districts are as described in section 7.2. Source: Collection from Graham Jaunay. Coverage: 1841. It includes the following, as applicable:

- Location and extent of the land.
- Crops (acres).
- Water access.
- Improvements: buildings, etc.

14.4 Declaration of Acreage

This collection includes declarations of the number of acres of land owned. The *Location* value is the Hundred name. Source: Government Gazettes. Coverage: 1847 to 1850.

14.5 Depasturing Licences

Coverage: 1842 to 1845.

14.6 Descriptions of Ruins

Coverage: 1844 to 1846.

14.7 Hundreds of Port Gawler, Grace, and Mudla Wirra

14.9 Landowners

A record of all land purchases in South Australia from a variety of records held by the State Library and State Records of South Australia. This only includes purchases from individuals and partnerships, not companies and organisations. Source: Collection from Graham Jaunay. Coverage: 1835 to 1841.

14.13 Original Purchasers of City of Adelaide Allotments

This collection lists the distribution of the Adelaide allotments (called Town Acres). *AllocTA* (in Notes) indicates the Town Acre number(s) allocated by lot; *AuctionTA* indicates the Town Acre number(s) subsequently bought at auction 3 weeks later. Coverage: 1840.

16. Medical Certificates

The *Government Gazette* frequently published a list of medical practitioners appointed to be vaccinators, e.g. "Town and District Vaccinators, under Act No. 16 of 1953, entitled 'An Act to extend and make compulsory the practice of Vaccination'". Source: Gazette. Coverage: 1854 to 1917.

16.4 Pharmacist/Chemist Register

Described as the "Pharmaceutical Register" in the Gazette. The EventDate is usually the date of registration by the Pharmacy Board. This may be qualified in Notes as reregistered or reinstated. Source: Gazette: Coverage: 1893 to 1991.

17. Miscellaneous Deaths

17.1 Drownings at Goolwa

A list of people who drowned at Goolwa or nearby. Even date is date of drowning. Source: collated by Fran Ramsay from unknown sources. Coverage: 1837 to 1998.

17.2 Hospital and Asylum Deaths

Provides a list of those you died at various hospitals and asylums.

Source #1: Parliamentary Paper. Coverage: 1858

Source #2: Government Gazette. Coverage: 1863 to 1945.

17.3 Stillbirths

Civil registration of stillborn children was not performed between 1842 and 1995. Source: Graham Jaunay's collection from various sources. Coverage: 1843 to 1993.

17.4 Unregistered Deaths

Many deaths were not registered. Lack of registration was often due to the legal complications needed for registering a death (e.g. securing a death certificate). Sometimes the reason may have been an oversight, others remoteness or the need to bury the body. This collection lists deaths which were reported in newspapers, gazettes, books, etc. but where the death of the same person was not registered (although it may have been registered under a different name). Deaths where the person's name was not known are not included. Source: Graham Jaunay's collection from various sources. Coverage: 1840 to 1970.

18. Military Service

Includes enlistment, travel, desertion, deaths, etc.

18.1 British Service Personnel Pensions

Pensions to Civil Officers of the Ordnance Department and the Irish Constabulary, Chelsea Out Pensioners, Greenwich Out Pensioners and East India Company Military Fund pensioners resident in South Australia. Where recorded, the Notes field shows Regiment, Dates of service and amount paid. Source: State Records, GRG122/4, pages 83-88. Coverage: 1843 to 1853, 1871 to 1875.

19. Murders & Executions

19.1 Murderers and Executions

A list of all those executed for murder up to 1965, including name of victim, location, and conviction date, where available. Coverage: 1840 to 1964.

20. Name Changes

20.1 Name Changes by Deed Poll

Source: extracted from the index books originally stored at the Lands Title Office. Coverage: 1915 to 1954, limited coverage 1891 to 1914, 1956 to 1975.

The records have been processed so that both the 'from' and 'to' names appear in the normal name fields, i.e., there are at least 2 records per name change. The other names appear in the Notes field, as either "Changed to:" or "Changed from:". For each name change there were originally 2 records: a 'change from' and a 'change to' record, which should have contained identical information. Unfortunately, due to uncertainty in the transcriptions this was often not the case, resulting in many alternatives in the indexes.

In addition:

- Where there are alternative surnames, additional records have been added.
- Where there are alternative given names, these are indicated as alternatives (e.g., "John/Jon") or as uncertainties (e.g., "John? Richard").

21. Naturalisations

21.1 Naturalisation

Naturalisation records taken from the Government Gazettes in those years. Sources and coverage as noted below:

1872: collated by Marion Hextall, from the Government Gazette 15 Aug 1872 (page 1146). Unfortunately, they don't include the date of the ceremony.

22. Nurses

22.1 Innamincka Inland Mission Nursing Sisters

A list of nurses who worked at the mission. Source: unknown. Coverage: 1929 to 1951.

22.2 Midwives

A list of registered midwives. Source: Gazette. Coverage: 1928 and 1950.

22.3 Nurses

A list of registered nurses (General Certificate). Includes registration date where recorded. Source: Gazette. Coverage: 1928 and 1950.

22.4 Specialist Nurses

A list of registered nurses in specialist areas of Mental Health, Infant Welfare, Infectious Diseases. Includes registration date where recorded. Source: Gazette. Coverage: 1950

23. Occupations (Not Listed Elsewhere)

23.1 Adelaide Art Engravers Employees List

A list of employees. EventDate is date of commencement. Coverage: 1936 to 1986.

23.2 Barristers, Attorneys and Solicitors

A list of Barristers, Attorneys and Solicitors. May be multiple entries per person for each year registered. Location is address of person. Source: Gazette. Coverage: 1846 to 1867 but excludes 1848.

23.3 Defence Science and Technology Organisation (DSTO) Apprentices

A list of apprentices with the DSTO, the date they started and their occupation. Source: Independent. Coverage: 1951 to 1990.

23.4 Fire Brigade Employees

A list of employees at various stations and their rank/position, where recorded. Records sourced from the State Records contain Place and Date of Birth. Sources and coverage as noted below:

Source #1: Service Record books – Fire Brigades' Board (GRG77/4), State Records. Coverage: 1885 to 1936, some undated.

Source #2: Parliamentary Papers. Coverage: 1889-1913.

23.5 Frearsons Printing House Hindmarsh Employees

A list of employees. Source: appear to have been taken from a photograph. Coverage: 1934.

23.6 Photographers

A list of photographers. Source: collated by Graham Jaunay from various sources including newspapers and government documents. Coverage: 1845 to 1910.

23.7 Port Pirie Smelter Employees

A list of employees at the Port Pirie Smelter. Where entered, Event Date is persons Date of Birth and Notes field contains employment start and end dates. Location contains the area of the smelter they worked in. Source: Independent. Coverage: 1888 to 1952.

23.8 Whaling Employees

A list of employees. Notes field contains employer. Source: Gazette. Coverage: 1844 to 1851.

24. Other

24.1 Ferris Saddlery Order Books

The books mainly contain orders, prices, and payments by customers of Ferris Saddlery (McLaren Vale). Coverage: 1889 to 1919.

Each record refers to the first entry for that person in one or more contiguous pages in a book. Users should browse subsequent pages to find other references to that person which may not have been included in the records.

The 'index' pages in each book refer to page numbers that book. Finding specific page numbers may be tricky, but generally those entries will normally have been included in the records as well.

24.2 First Gold Escort from Victorian Goldfields

The first gold escort was led by Inspector Tolmer and brought gold back from Victoria arriving back in Adelaide 19 March 1852. The names are those of the men sending gold back to Adelaide. Gives the name of the person to receive the gold, plus the weight of gold. Lists for later gold escorts were not printed after letters to the editor suggested possible danger to those who were receiving the gold. Source: Adelaide Observer 20 March 1852. Coverage: 19 March 1852.

24.3 Foster Parents

A list of people fostering or adopting. Source: State Records, GRG27/2. Coverage: 1918.

24.4 Insolvencies

People deemed insolvent by Court. Source: Government Gazette. Coverage: 1841 to 1928

24.5 Lands and Immigration Department Correspondence

Correspondence of a variety of topics sent to the Lands and Immigration Department. Source: compiled from various Government files. Coverage: 1849 to 1899.

24.6 Livestock Brand Registrations

A list of people registering their branding of cattle, horses and sheep. Where entered, shows type of livestock and location. Source: Government Gazette. Coverage: 1841, 1879 and 1886.

24.7 Loxton Mardi Gras Past Queens

A list of past queens of the Loxton Mardi Gras. Coverage: 1958 to 1985.

24.8 Suspected Fenians

A list of persons suspected of having Fenian sympathies.

24.9 Temperance Pledges

A list of persons giving their pledge to temperance. One set of records appears to be from the Wilmington area (possibly the school) and lists at least one parent.

Source #1: unknown. Coverage: 1890 to 1931.

Source #2: compiled by Andrew Peake from unknown source. Coverage: 1849-1855.

24.10 Yandama Time Capsule

Laid with foundation stone of Yandama Station, NSW, on 27 November 1899, listing those present at the laying of the stone. Opened 1964. Yandama Station is 220 km North of Broken Hill.

Coverage: 27 November 1899.

25. Parliamentary Papers

Parliamentary papers include reports from government departments, Royal Commissions, Committees of Inquiry and other documents which have been presented to a Parliament and then ordered by Parliament to be printed.

26.1 Manufacturing Districts Petition

Source: collected from Parliamentary Papers by Marion Hextall. Coverage: 1882.

26.2 Mt Bryan Children Listed on Petition for School

Source: collected from Parliamentary Papers by Marion Hextall. Coverage: 1881.

26.3 Parkhurst Petition

An article published listing all the names of petitioners living in South Australia at the time who opposed the sending of young British men held in custody in England to Australia. Containing some 1600 signatures it is arguable the most complete list of colonialists of the time. It was quite controversial as the sending of convicts to NSW had ceased and England wanted rid of the myriad of boys held in custody. SA naturally did not want them (or any convicts for that matter). Source: collated from various newspapers in the National Libraries Trove collection by Kevin Bowden. Coverage: 1844.

26.4 Protest Petition

A petition rejecting the resolutions made by a public meeting of the colonists held at the Queens Theatre on 3 May 1841. The meeting and petition related to the government's handling of the current economy crisis. Coverage: 1841

26.5 Woman's Suffrage Petition

A petition in favour of extending the right to vote to women, signed by 11,600 people, was collected by the Women's Christian Temperance Union and the Women's Suffrage League and was presented to the House of Assembly by the Hon. G C Hawker on 30th August 1894. It requested that women in the colony be granted the right to vote. The original petition can be viewed in Parliament House, Adelaide. The legislation giving women the right to vote was signed by Queen Victoria on 21/3/1895. Source: State Records, GRG 92/5. Coverage: 30 August 1894.

27. Pre-Civil Births, Deaths, Marriages

A collection of vital records of events occurring before civil registration of births, deaths and marriages began in 1842.

Source: collated from various sources, including newspapers, BISA, church records, etc. which are in some cases shown in the *Source2* or *Notes* field.

28. Police Appointments

28.1 District Constables – Appointments

A list of district constables, their appointments, promotions and demotions. Coverage: 1875 to 1899.

28.2 Police Constables – Appointments, Promotions and Demotions

A list of constables, their appointments, promotions, and demotions. Source: Gazette. Coverage: 1857 to 1864.

28.3 Police Joining 1857-1866

Past & present members of the Police Force. *EventDate* is the date of joining. Source: Collected from Parliamentary Papers by Marion Hextall. Coverage: 1857 to 1866.

29. Police Gazette Names

Source: derived from the South Australian Police Gazettes. Coverage: 1862 to 1933, 1935 and 1937 to 1940.

Each record identifies a person named in an article. Note that this may be as the perpetrator of a crime, or as the victim, or for some other purpose altogether.

In most cases it will be necessary to view the relevant Police Gazette to get value from the reference, and page numbers (and photo numbers) are provided for this purpose. Digital copies of the Police Gazette can be viewed at the Genealogy SA Library. They are also online at Ancestry.

The South Australian Police Gazette database has been compiled from the printed Indexes as published in each volume of the Police Gazettes. Some obvious errors have been corrected. However, in most cases the original text has not been checked. The assistance of the SA Police Historical Society in providing the Police Gazette volumes is gratefully acknowledged.

The *Event* field contains a summary of the types or articles and/or events referenced - occasionally this is extended into *Notes* when there is a large number of events. *Source2* contains the corresponding page numbers. The events and pages are both generally in chronological order of publication, but the user is warned that they often do not correspond 1:1.

Where the *Event* field contains, for example. "(NSW)", it indicates that this/these articles were copied from the NSW Police Gazette or other NSW sources.

33. School Teachers

33.1 Moonta Teachers

Source: derived from the school journal provided by Marilyn Philbey of the Yorke Peninsula Family History Group. Coverage: 1907 to 1973.

33.2 Teachers, Headmasters, Headmistresses, and other roles

A list of staff at various schools and their position, where recorded.

Source #1: Parliamentary Papers. Coverage: 1858, 1860 to 1862, 1864 to 1877.

Source #2: School records. Coverage: 1867 to 1969.

34. Social Welfare & Charity

Includes Destitute Board and Asylum activities, but not inmates of the Destitute Asylum which are in the *Hospital & Asylum Admissions* dataset.

34.1 Destitute Board Apprenticeships

A list of persons with apprenticeships arranged by the Destitute Board. Source: collected from Parliamentary Papers by Marion Hextall. Coverage: 1883.

34.2 Destitute Children Placement

Source: Parliamentary Papers. Coverage: 1871 to 1872.

34.3 Destitute Labourers

Source: Parliamentary Papers 1859-14, 1870-106. Coverage: 1859 and 1870.

34.4 Relief from Destitute Boards

A list of destitute persons receiving relief, including reasons in *Notes*. Source: collected from Parliamentary Papers by Marion Hextall. Coverage: 1867.

35. Succession Duties

35.1 Succession Duties 1876-1893

The *EventDate* is not always the date of death - it may sometimes refer to a date earlier or later than the death (e.g. the making of a will, or a decision made in executing the will). The *FileNo* may be used to request the file from State Records. Coverage: 1841 to 1893, limited records 1894 to 1914.

36. Surveyor Registers

36.1 Surveyors 1898-1995

A list of registered surveyors. Source: various Gazette between 1898 and 1995. Coverage: 1853 to 1994.

37. Appendix A

Parliamentary papers include reports from government departments, Royal Commissions, Committees of Inquiry and other documents which have been presented to a Parliament and then ordered by Parliament to be printed.

The records provided in these groups are those persons referred to in the paper.

Many of these papers result in groups of records which are relatively small (often <100 records), and the groups are often difficult to categorise. The policy here is to have a Set for Parliamentary Papers and only store them in different Sets if there is some real value in doing so (e.g. Railway Employees).
