



SAGHS – COVID-19 PRECAUTIONS
1 DECEMBER 2021 TO 31 JANUARY 2022

Dear Member,

Due to the opening of the South Australian borders on 23 November and the increased uncertainty of Covid-19 being present in our South Australian community, the Council has discussed thoroughly, at their November meeting, the appropriate actions to ensure the safety and well-being of our members, volunteers, visitors, staff and contractors.

As this was considered an occupational health and safety issue, which the Society takes seriously, it was agreed that in order to protect the health and welfare of everyone visiting and working at the Society's premises that the Council should take every precaution available.

Everyone who enters the building will only be allowed on site if they can demonstrate full vaccination against Covid-19 or that they have a current medical exemption from getting the vaccine. If not fully vaccinated best endeavours to offer alternative communication and working arrangements will be utilised.

It was agreed that a trial period commencing 1 December 2021 and extending to 31 January 2022 would be activated. Feedback from members, volunteers, and staff will be sought in the meantime and their views taken into account at the end of this trial period.

Face Masks

It is mandatory that all members, visitors, project and library volunteers wear face masks at all times, other than drinking or eating whilst seated. Face masks are available to all persons in the event that they do not have a mask. Up-to-date posters will be displayed at each entry point to the building to ensure that this mandatory process is followed.

Covid-19 Symptoms

If a guest/contractor/visitor is experiencing any Covid-19 symptoms, they must not enter the

building. If the individual/s do enter the site, they will be politely asked to leave in order to protect the safety of our members, volunteers and staff present at that time.

We appreciate your understanding of the systems that have been put in place to protect members, volunteers, staff and visitors to the Society, so that we may continue to provide all our regular services to the Genealogy SA community.
